
## TOILET TALK: COMFORT, HEIGHT & STYLE BREAKDOWN

## STANDARD HEIGHT VS. COMFORT (ADA) HEIGHT



Standard height toilets sit about 14–15 inches from the floor to the seat — great for kids or smaller adults.

Comfort height models are 17–19 inches tall, making them easier to sit on and stand up from — especially for taller folks, seniors, or anyone with mobility issues.

## **ELONGATED VS. ROUND BOWL**

Elongated toilets sit about 14" inches wide and 18" in length—offering more comfort and a roomier seat—ideal for adults and main bathrooms.

## **HOW MUCH SPACE DO I HAVE IN MY BATHROOM?**

Before picking a new toilet, make sure it'll actually fit your bathroom. Here's what to measure:

Rough-In Distance - Measure from the wall to the

Clearance Around the Toilet - At least 15" from the center of the toilet to any wall or vanity on either side and 24" clearance in front of the bowl.

Check Nearby Fixtures - Measure how close the toilet is to bathtubs, shower doors, or swinging entry doors. A tight fit can make even a good toilet feel like a bad idea.
